Amendment To The House Rules

When the House Committee met they recommended the following changes to the House Rules:

HR 6

Now Reads: Guests residing in the area who would be eligible to become member of the Order will be allowed to visit the club room a maximum of three (3) times. Guests not eligible for membership in the Order may visit the club room at the discretion of the Club governing body, subject at all times to the current beverage laws of the State of Florida.

Proposed Change: *Eliminate HR 6*

HR 7

Now Reads: With out prior approval of the club governing body a member, associate member or visiting Elk will be limited to four (4) nonmember guests per day, subject to the beverage laws of the State of Florida and other limitations set forth in these house rules.

Proposed Change: *With out the prior approval of the club governing body a member, associate member or visiting Elk may sign in guests, subject to the beverage laws of the State of Florida and other limitations set forth in these house rules.*

The meeting to vote on these changes will be at the first meeting in August. That date is August 2nd, 2010. The purpose of this special vote is for an Amendment to the House Rules, and any other changes can also be considered. This insures that all members of the Lodge have been afforded the opportunity to contribute their ideas and vote on the House Rule revisions which all members will have to observe.

August Volunteers of the Month!

As you know, one of the key functions of the Lodge is to provide charitable donations to our many deserving community organizations, and this is done thru the money earned at Bingo. Each of the Bingo Workers should be proud of the funds you raised over the last six months. Harry-Anna Trust Fund



The Florida Elks Youth Camp and Florida Elks Children's Therapy Services are dependent on the Harry-Anna Trust Fund for money to provide services for children statewide. These two very worthwhile charities are known as the "Florida Major Projects".

While some of the money to support our Florida Major Projects comes from the Elks National Foundation, a large amount has to be raised each year right here in Florida. State President, Vincent Como, has set a goal of \$1 million dollars. This is a per capita of \$14.89.

Please consider making a donation to the Harry-Anna Trust Fund. You can make a one time contribution or purchase a certificate. Certificates start as low as \$100 which requires a \$20 payment for 5 years. This is less than \$.50 per week.

Certificates are available from Al Shaffer, Lodge Chairman of the Harry-Anna Trust Fund Committee, or you can use the form that is published in the bulletin.

Our Lodge has always met our per capita for ENF, so let's try to do the same this year for the Harry-Anna Trust Fund.
